Qualifications:

Minimum Grade 12 or the equivalent in education, training and experience; Knowledge and experience of the Northern Tutchone Culture and Values; Knowledge of LSCFN Final Agreement and Self-Government Agreements or willingness to learn; willingness to process documents and forms that pertain to the position; Knowledge of and experience living in the Traditional Territory; Ability to work alone in the backcountry; Must have good organizational skills and the ability to work unsupervised and in a team; Knowledge of hunting and fishing techniques; Ability to organize and complete work schedules within time lines; Basic computer skills, data entry, data processing and analysis and word processing; Well-developed oral and written communication skills; Ability to interact with people, particularly hunters and recreational groups, with tactful, productive skill, including interviews with citizens regarding harvest information; Ability to deal with potentially difficult individuals with tactful and productive skill. **Small Engines Repair Certification is an asset; Valid Class 5 Yukon Driver's License; First Aid/CPR Certificate; willingness to pursue further training in wildlife management.**

Duties: This position is responsible to assist in delivering the fish and wildlife management program of Little Salmon Carmacks First Nation (LSCFN) Lands and Resources Department on lands within the Traditional Territory. The worker will spend most of their time out in the field and will have a variable work schedule that could include working after hours and weekends as well as the following:

- Monitor activities of LSCFN members and others within LSCFN Traditional Territory.
- Provide a stronger ground-based presence on the land.
- Provide information to wilderness travelers to increase awareness of local fish and wildlife issues and concerns.
- Identification of possible local fish and wildlife issues and concerns, ie. meat wastage, habitat degradation, littering, etc.
- Assist in the collection of harvest information in the LSCFN Traditional Territory, for example salmon, moose, caribou, etc.
- As required, attend meetings of the Carmacks Renewable Resources Council and other relevant boards, councils and committees.
- Maintain department equipment in serviceable condition.
- Writing monthly reports, recording of contacts, maintain a daily journal and submitting a final report at completion of term.
