Justice Coordinator/ Indigenous Court Worker

This position is a partnership with LSCFN and Yukon Government.

Job Summary:

- Reporting to Director of Life Long Learning, this position is responsible for planning, coordinating and delivering Justice services for community members.
- The position will refer accused to appropriate social, education, employment, medical and other resources to enable them to address the underlying problems, which contribute to their charges and, where appropriate, follow-up on these referrals.
- The position informs justice officials about the cultural traditions, values, languages, socio-economic conditions, and other concerns of the LSCFN community and the cultural perspective of the alleged accused and initiate further understanding when required.
- The position promotes an understanding within the LSCFN community of the existing Criminal Justice system and alternative or community justice processes and facilitates practical, community-based justice initiatives and helping to build community capacity to identify and address justice related problems, which impact community members.
- The position organizes along with other LSCFN Wellness staff crime prevention activities such as facilitating awareness sessions and organizing wellness circles, or healing camps.

Qualifications:

- Certificate or diploma in a social or justice related field, or equivalence in experience and relevant course work.
- Knowledge of Territorial Justice System including court setting, protocols and routine.
- Community Justice, traditional justice theories and models and alternate methods for administration of justice such as Restorative Justice desired.
- Knowledge of all agreements desired or needs to be obtained on the job, including: Umbrella Final Agreement (UFA), Self-Government Agreement (SGA) and First Nations Final Agreement (FNFA).
- Valid Yukon Driver's License Class 5 required, Class 4 to be obtained within 6 months on the job to transport clients,
- Criminal Record Check, and ability to maintain a healthy lifestyle.
