### **Lands Manager Lands and Resources Department Permanent-Full Time**

#### **Qualifications:**

The Lands Manager must possess a degree or diploma in environmental studies, land management, land use planning, natural resources management, geography, or a related discipline. The Lands Manager must possess a minimum of three years of work experience in a related field, including direct experience with designing and leading research projects on the land; Must possess a thorough understanding of the LSCFN Final Agreement, Self-Government Agreement, and relevant territorial and federal laws and regulatory processes; Knowledge on basic office software; Strong written and verbal communication skills; Ability to delivering reports and educational sessions to a wide variety of audiences; Ability to work effectively with minimal supervision, supervising and directing staff in a professional fashion; **Some training may be provided; Class 5 Driver's License.**

#### **Main Duties:**

Reporting to the Lands and Resources Director, the Lands Manager acts with considerable independence performing duties consistent with the position description and other duties as follow:

The Lands Manager contributes to the implementation of integrated lands and resources management by:

- As part of an interdisciplinary team, apply integrated lands and resources management within LSCFN's traditional territory;
- Prepare, administer, and implement ongoing and special land use planning;
- Develop and implement land use research projects, including the production of scenarios and projections through the use of statistical research software;
- Draft and deliver land use reports at the Director's request for a variety of audiences;
- Support land use planning as it pertains to economic development, economic partnerships, social programs, renewable and non-renewable resources, consultation, and accommodation obligations, and capacity development;
- Integrate Dooli Law into land use planning;
- Collaborate with other LSCFN staff in the completion of land use studies;
- Monitor land use activities within and near LSCFN's traditional territory.
- Liaise and proactively engage with relevant agencies in other governments, including federal, territorial, and First Nations;
- Prepare for and attend meetings of other government agencies in order to ensure LSCFN interests are protected;
- Collaborate with Director of Lands & Resources in the development of position statements and similar documents for presentation to other government agencies and provide support to other LSCFN staff engaging with similar agencies;
- Other duties as required in the job description.
