Qualifications:

- Extensive knowledge of navigating the Yukon River
- Knowledge of LSCFN traditional territories
- An understanding of resource management activities and issues in the Yukon Territory.
- An understanding of Northern Tutchone Culture and the LSCFN Final Agreement.
- Ability to present information to a First Nation audience, to Government officials, and to the public.
- Ability to work in a remote setting.
- Boat License and knowledge of boat safety, Valid Wilderness First-Aid / CPR certificate, fish and wildlife habitat identification, recreation site planning and management, and the management of heritage values. Valid Class 5 Yukon Driver's License.
- Strong communication skills both written and oral.
- Proven supervision skills.

Duties: Nän Nena Dän Do K'ānete (The Department of Lands & Resources) is seeking a motivated person to work as our River Ranger. Reporting to Lands and Resource Director, this position will be responsible for the following:

- Preparation for the field season by:
 - understanding the objectives of the program
 - securing all field equipment (purchases and rentals)
 - planning and scheduling of weekly field activities
 - submitting weekly work records (time sheets) to the supervisor
- Coordination of field activities with other Government agencies and other First Nations.
 - Communications with YTG Conservation Officer Program, YTG Parks Branch and YTG Biologists
 - communications with overlapping First Nations as needed
 - As instructed by Fish and Wildlife Tech. river monitors must be willing to assist with monitoring fish camps along LSCFN traditional territory as well as cleaning garbage at campsite
- Maintenance and care of all field equipment.
 - keeping a record of all equipment related issues, such as repairs, replacements, losses, etc.
- Preparation and submission of a final report for the field season.
 - the report will include a summary of all activities, problems, and recommendations for the next season
