Qualifications:

A degree or diploma in social work or addictions field. Post-secondary education in substance abuse issues or counseling or equivalent. Life experience is an asset; Familiar with Northern Tutchone language and culture; general office procedure; community development experience; well-developed oral and written communication skills; computer skills; Class 5 driver's license; PAL license; ATV/Boat license (up to 6 months to obtain);

Personal suitability: no addiction issues for at least two years; completion of a substance abuse treatment program; well into the healing journey; positive attitude to healing; positive interest and supportive attitude toward all individuals and groups in the community and empathy with people of different backgrounds and education; ability to communicate effectively with elders, youth and citizens; public support for the LS/CFN policies and objectives; ability to work with minimal supervision and ability to work cooperatively with individuals and groups; willingness to train and be trained; responsible, professional attitude to work; demonstration of a positive role model in the community, non-participant in lateral violence (gossip).

Duties: Reporting to Dän Sóthän Nùtl'et Do - Health & Social Director, the Traditional Wellness Worker is responsible for providing traditional and cultural services to the citizens of Little Salmon/Carmacks First Nation. This position also provides program planning, coordinates and facilitates programming, including the "Men's Rising Warriors Program" and "Women's Building Our Matriarch's Program". This position also works with a team in the Dän Sóthän Nùtl'et Do - Health & Social Department to assist in activities/programming of the general healing of the community. The Traditional Wellness Worker will work collaboratively with the Community Wellness Program, other LSC departments, Yukon Government Services and NGOs to assist our FN citizens.
